Past Venturing Terms

Council Officer

- CSVE Results: As a two-term council VOA president, I led my council to be 1 of only 3 councils in the Central Region to receive the CSVE Award in 2014. When the new structure was released, we then earned Silver Level in both 2015 and 2016.
- Membership: We had positive growth in membership for 2 years in a row while I was president. To continue this trend, I still remain active in my council, working directly with our Scout Executive and Program Committee to plan a council-wide Venturing recruitment campaign.
- Program Acknowledgement: Gained recognition for Venturing by advocating for the Eagle Scout
 recognition dinner to include our program. This year, we formally changed the name of the event to
 "Youth Achievement Dinner", and presented Summit Awards and VLAs. For my efforts in making
 the event possible, I was asked to serve as our council's first even youth to be Master of
 Ceremonies.

Area Officer

- Area Conference: Successfully promoted our most diverse Area 3 Conference ever, with 9 out of 11 councils sending contingents. I created a promotional video and coordinated the recruitment of staff, with a final count of around 100 participants.
- CSVE: Collected CSVE forms from 10 out of our area's 11 councils, regardless of qualification status. Served as a region CSVE coordinator simultaneously. These opened lines of communication with the councils, and sparked conversations about starting VOAs in two new councils.
- PIVOT: Helped develop a region-wide training curriculum (called PIVOT) aimed specifically at starting sustainable VOAs in councils that were struggling. I helped to develop content for the course, as well as test pilot the training, and shared it with several other region's areas.
- Region Operating Procedures: Helped edit a completely revised set of operating procedures for the
 region, to be approved by the region cabinet. These were aimed to be a practical roadmap for
 future officers to use as a resource when planning their terms.

Region Officer

- CSVE: Led the nation in number of CSVE forms collected, with roughly 70% of Central Region
 councils submitting a form, compared to the national average of less than 40% submitted. These
 forms will allow us to focus efforts in councils that do not have VOAs but are interested in starting.
- Website Development: Recognizing that the internet is one of our primary forms of communication
 with Venturers, I helped lead a complete redesign on the national Venturing website, and I am
 currently working to redesign the Central Region website as well.

Major Projects

National Website

- I served as one of the main contributors on the National "Venturing.org"
 Website redesign taskforce. From assessing the old site, to new content development, to designing the current layout from scratch, I worked on every stage of the project.
- New features include things like a centrally located Venturing calendar, all council VOA social media links, ready access to award requirements, VOA tips and tricks, lists of possible scholarships, and many more resources.
- Even now after publishing, I continue to add new features that will enhance the experience of Venturers and Advisors using the site, giving them easier access to the primer source of Venturing information.



Training Developments

- I developed and compiled a database of nearly 30 unique Venturing-specific trainings, giving Venturers nationwide access to professionally themed PowerPoints to use at their region, area, and council conferences.
- The trainings cover topics such as Marketing and Recruiting, the ALPS Program Model, Putting the "Wow" into Your Events, Starting a VOA, Venturing Terminology and Uniforms, and dozens more.
- Currently, I am leading a collaborative taskforce between Central Region and Western Region; we are looking into expanding this current project to include completely revamping Personal Safety Awareness training, as well as creating new resources to accompany Crew Officer Orientation, ILSC, and Project Management trainings.





Area Status Reports

- As a resource for our region Officer
 Orientation, I organized the data from all the
 2015 CSVE forms from the Central Region and compiled it with recent membership trends.
- This was then distributed to all our areas, so they could see the categories with growth potential for our region, as well as categories that need improvement, and target them specifically.
- I presented on the importance on building relationships with councils, and how these status reports can give us vital information that will assist us in starting sustainable VOAs.



National Goals

Communication

- Grow social media presence by creating Facebook hashtag campaigns and events throughout the year, encouraging youth to share pictures/stories with their friends of Venturing's opportunities.
- More fully utilize our other media platforms, such as Twitter, Instagram, and Snapchat. Work with region VPs of Com. to create a coordinated inter-region communication team that manages the various sites.
- Add features to the national website marketing toolbox, such as a social media banner template, that Venturers can use as their cover photos.
- Publish quarterly updates of national/regional Venturing endeavors, so Venturers/Advisors stay informed and feel connected. Publicize methods for people to give feedback and suggestions on the program.

Adventure

- Expand the current Central Region "Where to Go Venturing" database of Venturing-specific summer camps to encompass the other regions.
- Increase awareness of VenturingFest and Venturing Blast as affordable ways to experience high adventure bases while learning/ interacting with Venturers from across the nation.

Sustainability

- Publish more examples of recruitment events and feature them on social media platforms for crews to utilize. Discuss both traditional crews, as well as niche ones, such as college crews.
- Increase online database of scholarships available to Venturers, to show that they can be recognized for their successes.



Training

- Create more supplemental trainings to publish in the "Training Toolbox" so crews/councils/areas have easy access to any training resources they may need.
- Work to improve current ALPS trainings by modernizing Personal Safety Awareness Training, adding new ethical controversy examples, and more.

Leadership

- Encourage regions/areas to build up their committees; this allows for more delegation of tasks, as well as gets new youth involved, motivated, and comfortable with running for positions the next year.
- Spark inter-region collaboration, such as communication, admin, and program teams to work together on projects and ideas.
- Support council VOAs through giving areas CSVE results in a useable format. Support the start of district VOAs in large councils, and create a full complement of patches for their officers.

Awards

- Produce more resources that promote the ALPS awards and make it more visibly an equal to the Eagle Scout, such as example courts of honor, a Summit Award pocket card, mentor pins, certificate frames, coins, etc.
- Add a "Certificate Creator" to the website, similar to what Central Region has, that lets you customize certificates to give out to recognize achievements.
- Create an interactive "Summit Map" for the website that shows pins on locations of various Summit projects across sthe nation and a description of the impact they had on their communities.
