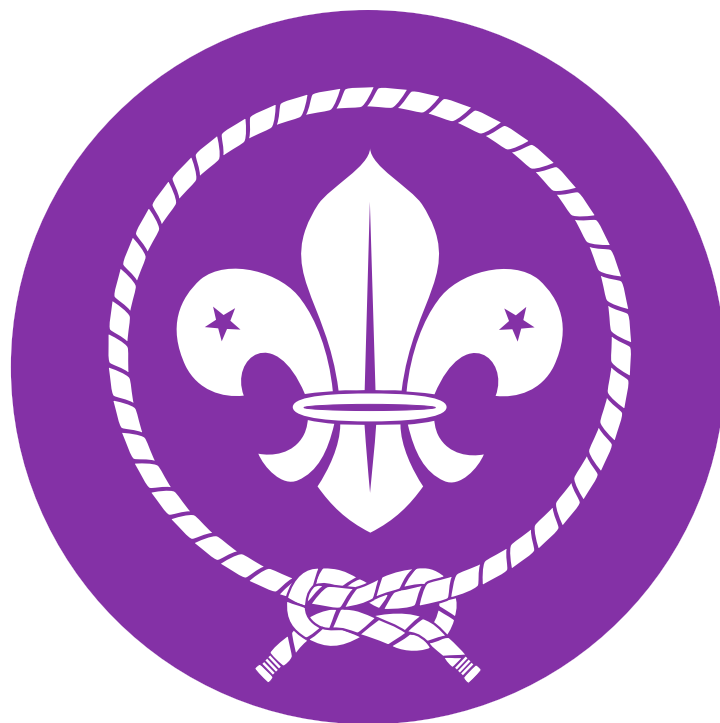

Giving Leadership to International Events Held in Other Countries

- a. Serve as an adult leader in a BSA contingent to a world Scout jamboree or Interamerican Scout jamboree.
