**Course times:** The action begins at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, March 20 and ends approx. 2:00pm on Sunday, March 21.

### Housing Information

Housing for this school will be your choice. There are several nice hotels in the area. Due to the unique school location this year, please make your own reservations for lodging for the night of the 19<sup>th</sup> (recommended early arrival) and the 20<sup>th</sup> (school night). **Note: The course fee for this school has been reduced to accommodate this situation. Please coordinate reimbursement with your council before the course.**

**Weather:** It will be cold, and it may snow. Bring suitable footwear, coat, gloves. Be prepared for some outdoor activities during the day.

**Covid-19 and National Camping School** - Local council host sites will continue to practice any locally required COVID19/communicable disease mitigation strategies. Prior to your arrival, you will receive additional information about what precautions will be in place at your NCS site. If local area restrictions do not allow a course to be held, you will be contacted no less than 14 days in advance and given an alternative training option.

These precautions are important, but these efforts cannot eliminate the potential for exposure to COVID-19 or any other illness while at camp. Information from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) states that older adults and people of any age who have serious underlying medical conditions are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19. If you are in this group, please ensure you have approval from your health care provider prior to attending National Camping School.

### **Before You Arrive at NCS:**

- Fill out the NCS Personal Resource Questionnaire [HERE](#) and bring to camp school.
- Take the online NCS course here and the in-person Council led NCS course. Don't forget the other required prerequisites: [Youth Protection Training](#) and [Cub Scout Leader Position Specific training](#), including Hazardous Weather Training.

### **What to Take to Camp School:**

- Proof of BSA registration & prerequisite online training courses (Youth Protection Training, Cub Scout Leader Position Specific Training, Camp School Online Training, and Council-led Camp School Training).
- Your completed BSA health form (parts A and B, including a Tetanus date).

- Samples of your council's day camp promotional materials, staff manuals, or other camp literature, registration forms, schedules, etc., for display or giveaway. Make copies for at least 30 participants (No copying services are available at camp).
- Interesting crafts or activity ideas to share.
- Your camp T-shirt—there will be an opportunity for everyone to wear theirs.
- Notepad and pencil or pen. A participant binder and learning materials will be provided.
- NCS Online Trading Post: You can preview and purchase specialty National Camp School items (shirts, sweatshirts, and more!) to be sent directly to your home via [BSA National Supply!](#)

### **Personal Gear:**

- **Official complete BSA uniform.** No uniform parts are available for sale at camp school.
- Personal care items needed for hotel stay.
- Coat, jacket, suitable footwear/socks, gloves, hat. Snow is a possibility!
- Camera (Shoot the displays and show others back home what can be done!)
- Cell phone coverage at this site is relatively strong

### **What to Expect and What Is Expected:**

- Arrive rested. Be prepared for concentration, participation, and fun! Days last early morning to late at night.
- You must arrive no later than 8:30 a.m. on the first day, and attend all sessions through the last day to be certified\*\*
- In order to focus on the learning, please leave the distractions of life behind: family, children, pets, job, etc. Note also, there are no accommodations for anyone but you.
- Please understand that if you receive the names and contact information for other participants or for staff, you may not contact them for commercial purposes unless you receive their expressed permission to do so.

### **\*\* Note Regarding Absences for Religious Reasons**

Occasionally participants ask to be excused from parts of NCS for religious reasons. It is expected that before requesting, you first seek permission from your pastor or bishop to attend the entire school, and then seek substitutes to fulfill teaching responsibilities, etc. NCS is a once-in-five years occurrence; more critical than most other Scouting activity. Requests must be written to the associate regional director, and outline what was done in an attempt to experience the entire course. Even then, excuses can only be granted if a camp school staff member is willing to review with you, all sessions missed.

## Getting to the Rocky Mountain Estes Service Center

**From Denver** – Travel south on Interstate 25 to Exit 101 (Hwy 50 West. Hwy 47 East – Canon City). Proceed to the right (Hwy 50 West) to Pueblo Blvd. Exit (right hand exit). Turn left off the ramp onto Pueblo Blvd. Continue to Boy Scout Way. Turn right and then left onto Park Drive. The office is on your left

**From Albuquerque:** Go north on Interstate 25 until Exit 94 – Pueblo Boulevard/Hwy 45 North. Turn left off the ramp onto Pueblo Boulevard. Proceed until Goodnight Avenue. Turn left onto Goodnight Avenue and left again onto Park Drive. The office is on your left after a few blocks.
