LISTEN	 1a. Choose an issue that you care about and research how it affects your local community and other communities around the world. 1b. Identify organizations that work to tackle that issue and ways that they are addressing it. They can be local or international organizations. 1c. Learn more about a particular program carried out by one of these organizations. 1d. Discuss the issue you chose with your Messengers of Peace Project Advisor. 			
ACKNOWLEDGE	 2a. Find a partner organization to plan a Messengers of Peace project with and agree on a project area. 2b. Learn what your partner organization has done in the past in this area to combat the issue your project will tackle. 2c. At a unit meeting, educate the adult leadership and youth about the issue you are working to fix and the organization you will be partnering with. Share what they have done in the past pertaining to the issue and how your project will create positive change. 			
RESPOND	 3a. Complete a minimum of 20 hours of service on a Messengers of Peace project. 3b. Organize MoP events for service hours across all participants, including service hours with another organization. These events can be for one-off project or perpetual efforts. Hours counted towards earning the MoP Champion Award cannot be double counted towards this award. 3c. Create and execute a plan for the sustainment of your project. This could be a plan for how a physical location will be maintained, a volunteer timetable, or drawing up an agreement with a partner organization who will take on the upkeep. 			
COLLABORATE	 4a. Educate everyone who takes part in your Messengers of Peace project about the program and enable them to earn their Messengers of Peace Advocate (purple-edge) ring. Scouts who participate in your project will earn the Advocate ring. 4b. Present on your Messengers of Peace project to your Partner Organization AND your local District or Council. 4c. Record your project in INTERNET ADVANCEMENT/SCOUTBOOK under MoP Service Hours (see page 13) to ensure your hours are tracked towards your rank advancement. Use this GOOGLE FORM to also record your hours for our national database. You may also share your project through SDGS.SCOUT.ORG. 4d. Submit a write up of your project to your Council's MoP Committee OR Scout Executive. 4e. Tell others about your project, in one of the following ways: Share it on social media with the hashtag #MessengersOfPeaceScoutingAmerica Submit a write up of your project to a community newsletter or local news organization Submit a write up of your project to one of the organizations you identified in 1b
