## Critical information about your National Camping School participation

#### LOCATION:

L.E. Phillips Scout Reservation 2900 16<sup>th</sup> Street Rice Lake, WI 54868

#### **COURSE DATES:**

May 30-June 5, 2026

#### **CHECK-IN:**

Upon arrival at the main L.E. Phillips Scout Reservation entrance, follow signs to Huntsinger Lodge (marked in yellow on the map below). All participants must arrive at the Huntsinger Lodge between 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. (Central Time) on Saturday, May 17, 2025. See maps at the bottom of this letter for detailed maps and directions. Any registration-related questions may be directed to the Scouting America National Office (ncs@scouting.org).

#### **EARLY ARRIVALS\*:**

If you need to arrive on Friday, May 29 due to travel arrangements, please select "Early Arrival" in the online registration system. The early arrival fee of \$55\* includes dinner on Friday and breakfast on Saturday. Early arrival check-in will be at Huntsinger Lodge; instructions will be posted there for anybody arriving after 10 p.m.

Note: For those who are not registered as early arrivals, your first meal will be lunch on Saturday, May 30, 2026.







## TRANSPORTATION (Additional Fee):

The Chippewa Valley Council has made arrangements for airport shuttle service from both the Minneapolis-St. Paul Airport (MSP) and the Chippewa Valley Regional Airport (EAU). If you plan to travel by air, please schedule flight arrival for no later than 7:00 p.m. Friday, May 29 or 8:00 a.m. Saturday, May 30. The airport shuttle fee is \$75 round trip. These arrangements must be made prior to the course by contacting Eric Muench at eric.muench@scouting.org.

The return shuttle will arrive at MSP/EAU no later than 12:00 pm on Friday, June 5.

PLEASE NOTE: Shuttle reservations must be submitted by Noon (Central Time) May 28, 2026.

#### **ANNUAL HEALTH & MEDICAL RECORD:**

Your camp health screening will take place at check-in. Please make sure Part C of your Annual Health & Medical Record has been signed by a Medical Doctor, Physician's Assistant (master's degree) or a Licensed Nurse Practitioner within 12 months of the last day of this NCS session. Those without a current Annual Health & Medical Record will be required to obtain one at their own expense before being allowed to remain in camp. #### **DIETARY NEEDS:**

If you have special dietary requirements, please let L.E. Phillips Scout Reservation know in advance either through the registration process or by emailing eric.muench@Scouting.org. The camp's isolated location limits the availability of many specialized or kosher food items and these items may need to be brought from home.

Meals are varied, and there is always a salad/fruit bar, cereal with milk, and peanut butter and jelly available for sandwiches. Refrigeration is available in the Health Lodge for medications.

## PREREQUISITES:

Please note that there are pre-requisite training courses which you MUST have before you attend NCS. Please ensure you bring support materials (certificates) with you as proof. Those participants who arrive without their prerequisites completed may not be certified.

- Range Activities Director: NRA Basic (Rifle & Shotgun), NRA Instructor (Rifle & Shotgun), online portion of the USA Archery Level 1 course
- Aquatics Director: Current Lifeguard certification (BSA Lifeguard, Red Cross Lifeguard, YMCA Lifeguard, Starfish Aquatics Institute Starguard, Ellis & Associates International Lifeguard Training Program, or equivalent) Safe Swim Defense and Safety Afloat training and proven swimming skills.
- **COPE Director:** COPE Level I Instructor





- Climbing Director: Climbing Level I Instructor

- CCPT: Current NCS COPE Director or NCS Climbing Director certification, have a Portfolio
  demonstrating 50 hours of face-to-face COPE or Climbing instruction with participants as a
  NCS Director or Level I or II instructor within the last 3 years. No more than 5 hours can be
  spent on administrative activities.
- ALL: BSA Youth Protection Training

#### **WEATHER:**

Some of the scheduled programming will take place outdoors. This course will be held in northern Wisconsin in June. Temperatures can be as high as 70° F during the day and as low as 40° at night. Please bring suitable warm clothing, rain gear, and a hat.

### **ACCOMODATIONS:**

You will be staying in campsites with cabins. Our cabins are not insulated and feature cots with mattresses. There is no electricity in the campsites. There are several locations to charge your personal devices around camp. Each campsite has latrines and sinks. Shower houses with individual shower stalls and flush toilets are a short walk away from your campsite. If you require electricity for CPAP, be sure to indicate that in your registration or confirm with <a href="mailto:eric.muench@scouting.org">eric.muench@scouting.org</a>. Special housing arrangements will be made for those with CPAP or mobility concerns.

**INSECTS:** Northern Wisconsin in late spring is known to have many mosquitos, deer flies, and ticks. If you are sensitive to insect bites, plan on bringing insect repellent, mosquito netting for your cot, and treated clothing. We are in a highly concentrated area for ticks & Lymes disease. #### **DRESS CODE:**



# **Directions to L.E. Phillips Scout Reservation:**



## Via US 53: (in Yellow on Map):

- 1. Exit Highway at County Highway V
- 2. Head West on County Highway V, towards Haugen for .5 miles
- 3. Turn Right to head North on County Highway VV (Plecity Avenue)
- 4. Turn left at 3rd Street to stay on county Highway VV (heading west)
- 5. Follow VV for 3 miles until you reach Camp Phillips main entrance (B)

## <u>Via US Highway 8 / US Highway 63 from Minneapolis-St. Paul Area (Green on Map):</u>


- 1. Take US Highway 8 or US Highway 63 to Turtle Lake, WI
- 2. Turn Left on Highway 63 North
- 3. Stay on Highway 63 for approximately 14 miles
- 4. Turn right on County Highway B. Follow County Highway B for approximately 10 miles
- 5. Turn left on County Highway V. Follow County Highway V for approximately 5 miles
- 6. Turn Left to head North on County Highway VV (Plecity Avenue)
- 7. Turn left at 3rd Street to stay on county Highway VV (heading west)
- 8. Follow VV for 3 miles until you reach Camp Phillips main entrance (B)
