**CHECK-IN:**

When you arrive at Sea Base, please park in the parking lot adjacent to the Administration Office on the right-hand side of Toll Gate Boulevard (just past the Sea Base sign) and head up to the lobby for check-in. The Administration Office is a grey building. All participants should plan to arrive between 9:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. (EST) on Saturday, January 17, 2026. Driving directions are listed below and a camp map is attached to this letter. Any registration-related questions may be directed to the Scouting America National Office ([ncs@scouting.org](mailto:ncs@scouting.org)).

**\* EARLY ARRIVALS:**

If you need to arrive on Friday, January 16<sup>th</sup> due to travel arrangements, please select "Early Arrival" in the online registration system. The Early Arrival fee of \$55\* includes dinner on Friday and breakfast on Saturday. Early arrival check-in will be in the Administration Office Lobby.

*Note: For those who are not registered as early arrivals, your first meal will be lunch on Saturday, January 17<sup>th</sup>*



**AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION (Additional Fee):**

The most convenient airport for visiting Sea Base is Miami International Airport [MIA]. Shuttle service to and from Miami International Airport is available for a \$110 fee. Sea Base will provide two airport shuttle options from MIA to Sea Base on Friday, January 16 at 3:00 PM for early arrivals, and on Saturday, January 17<sup>th</sup> at 9:00AM.

Return shuttles will arrive at MIA by 4:00 PM on Tuesday, January 20 (retraining only) and by 12:00 PM on Friday, January 23 (full session). If you plan to use this service, you need to reserve your seat ahead of time by contacting Sea Base Director of Operations, Jason Lewis at [Jason.Lewis@scouting.org](mailto:Jason.Lewis@scouting.org) or Local Council Liaison, Mike Johnson, at [Michael.Johnson3@scouting.org](mailto:Michael.Johnson3@scouting.org)

PLEASE NOTE: Shuttle and Early Arrival Reservations must be submitted by January 14<sup>th</sup>.

**DRIVING DIRECTIONS:**

It is approximately a 2-hour drive to Sea Base from Miami International Airport. If you are renting vehicles, take the appropriate rental car bus to the rental center. Ask for directions to Highway 836, also known as the Dolphin Expressway. Follow 836 west to Turnpike exit. The Florida Turnpike is a toll road and you will pass through three toll gates at \$1 apiece. Take the Turnpike south; it ends in Florida City and turns into U.S. 1. Continue south on U.S. 1 through several islands linked by the highway to Lower Matecumbe (the island where Sea Base is located). You are looking for MM 74 at the south end of Lower Matecumbe. If you cross one more bridge you've gone too far. The landmark on your left (across the street from Sea Base) is a sign for Caloosa Cove. Turn right onto Toll Gate Shores Blvd. Go past the Sea Base sign on the left and take the first right into a large chain link fenced lot with a grey building. Go upstairs to check in at the lobby or call (305) 664-7766.

**ANNUAL HEALTH & MEDICAL RECORD:**

Your camp health screening will take place at check-in. Please make sure Part C of your Annual Health & Medical Record has been signed by a Medical Doctor, Physician's Assistant (master's degree) or a Licensed Nurse Practitioner within 12 months of the last day of this NCS session. Those without a current Annual Health & Medical Record will be required to obtain one at their own expense before being allowed to remain in camp. **DIETARY NEEDS:**

Sea Base will do its best to accommodate your dietary needs and allergies. In order to do so please complete the Sea Base Dietary Notification Form and return at: [Sea Base Dietary Notification Form](#) and return it to [michael.whisnant@scouting.org](mailto:michael.whisnant@scouting.org) at least 14 days in advance of NCS. In some cases Sea Base may not be able to accommodate your dietary needs and may ask you to bring your own food.

Please note that there are pre-requisite training courses which you **MUST** have before you attend NCS. Please ensure you bring support materials (certificates) with you as proof. Those participants who arrive without their prerequisites completed may not be certified.

Some of the scheduled programming will take place outdoors. While daytime temperatures in January can be in the low to mid 70's, it may get chilly at night. Please bring suitable warm clothing, rain gear, and a hat.

#### ACCOMMODATIONS:

Housing will be provided in dorm-style bunkhouses with beds and mattresses. Bedding (blankets, sheets, and pillows) will be provided. Please bring your own towel as these **WILL NOT** be provided. You do not need to arrive in Field Uniform but you will need it for the Opening Lunch on Saturday, January 17<sup>th</sup>. We encourage participants to bring a Hawaiian shirt for the Luau.
