



## Welcome to National Camping School at Curtis S. Read Scout Reservation!

**COURSE DATES: June 13–19, 2026**

Congratulations—your National Camping School application has been received! Whether this is your first time attending NCS or a return visit, we are excited to welcome you to **Curtis S. Read Scout Reservation** this June. This letter includes all the essential information you need to prepare for arrival, settle in smoothly, and begin a successful week of certification training.

### CHECK-IN INFORMATION

**Saturday, June 13, 2026 – 9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. (EST)**

Follow signs to **Camp Buckskin** upon entering the main gate.

#### Upon Arrival, You Will:

1. Park your vehicle in the designated lot near Camp Buckskin.
2. Check in with the registrar and verify your registration.
3. Complete your health screening (bring your forms!).
4. Visit your section area for a short check-in and interview.
5. Receive your housing assignment and move into your tent (no electricity!).
6. Change into the appropriate uniform for lunch and opening activities.

**Your first scheduled activity is lunch at 12:00 p.m.**

### EARLY ARRIVAL (OPTIONAL)

If travel requires you to arrive earlier, select **Early Arrival** during online registration.

**Early Arrival: Friday, June 12, 2026**

- **Fee:** \$55\*
- **Includes:** Friday dinner + Saturday breakfast
- Check-in at Camp Buckskin beginning at 5:00 p.m.
- Your first formal activity is Saturday lunch, there is no programming prior to that.



### AIRPORT AND TRAIN TRANSPORTATION (Additional Fee)

The nearest major airport is **Albany International Airport (ALB)**. We can provide a shuttle for you. A shuttle to & from camp is also available from **Albany–Rensselaer Amtrak Station**.

- **Saturday, June 13** – 9:00 a.m. for all others

##### Departure Shuttles:

Will leave camp based on the earliest transportation times.

### VISITORS

Family members and guests are **not permitted** during the course.

Only participants and faculty may be on camp property during NCS.

### ANNUAL HEALTH & MEDICAL RECORD – REQUIRED

You must bring a current **Annual Health & Medical Record (Parts A, B, & C)**.

Part C must be signed by a licensed medical provider **within 12 months of June 19, 2026**.

Participants without complete medical forms must obtain them at their own expense before being allowed to remain in camp.

**Climbing Director:** Climbing Level I Instructor

### Camp Director & Program Director:

- NCAP Training
- Unlawful Harassment Prevention
- Youth-on-Youth Training

## PREPARING FOR THE WEEK (FIRST-TIMER ESSENTIALS)

### The Pace of NCS

NCS is an immersive certification program—not a summer camp session.

Expect:

- Full days of instruction
- Evening assignments
- Hands-on demonstrations
- Assessments before certification

Come prepared and ready to learn.

### UNIFORMS

- **Field Uniform:** Required for meals, formations, evening programs, and campfire
- **Activity Uniform:** All other times



### **Check-in Uniform Recommendation:**

Arrive in **Activity Uniform**; bring your Field Uniform for lunch and afternoon activities.

### **ACCOMMODATIONS**

Participants stay in **Scouting America platform tents** with foam mattresses.

What you need to know:

- Bedding/linens **not provided**
- There is NO electricity in the campsites (charging stations available during the day)
- Tents are shared; most participants will have a tentmate
- Shower and restroom facilities are within walking distance
- CPAP users need to bring **battery-capable devices**, there is no power in the campsites

### **PACKING GUIDANCE FOR FIRST-TIME PARTICIPANTS**

#### **Top Required Items**

- Field & Activity Uniforms (multiple shirts)
- Sleeping bag and pillow – it can be 40 degrees at night in June!
- Rain gear & warm layers (see temperature note above!)
- Comfortable hiking footwear
- Water bottle
- Notebook and pens
- Flashlight or headlamp
- Personal toiletries
- Sunscreen & insect repellent

#### **Program-Specific Items**

Refer to the attached equipment list—some sections require:

- Swim gear (Aquatics)
- Climbing gloves or personal harness (Climbing)
- Laptop/tablet (Camp Director sections)
- NRA or USA Archery materials (Range Activities)

#### **What NOT to Bring**

- Personal firearms or ammunition
- Alcohol, drugs, or tobacco products (strictly prohibited)
- Pets
- Non-battery-capable CPAP machines

### **EMERGENCY CONTACT & COMMUNICATION**

Cell coverage on camp property is limited.

For urgent needs, families may contact the camp office (number included in your packet).

Directional signage in camp will clearly guide you to the correct facilities.
